

## CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF JUNE 1, 2009

The first regular June meeting of the Mannington City Council was held Monday, June 1, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. In the absence of Mayor Frank White, Councilman at Large Bob Garcia presided and other council members present were Betty Liller, Harold Rosencrance, Terry Starsick and Del Watson.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last meeting and they stood approved as read.

In the visitors' portion, Jim Byard said that the area behind his house needs leveled and seeded by the water project contractor. Superintendent Charles Rexrode is to call the contractor.

Plant operator Ted Nice said he was contacted by Mannington PSD about water quality problems since the pool at Hough Park was filled. He said the Health Department has recommended that MPSD flush their system.

Garcia read the Street & Water Department report.

Fluharty reported that Zach Dobbins of Gary Bennett's firm will be up the week of June 22 to review the Water Department books to determine the needed rate increase. She also said the mayor and council must meet as the Board of Canvassers to canvass tomorrow's election results. It was agreed to meet on June 8 at 6:00 p.m.

Under new business, the first item was Mark Dunigan's request for a street light by his house. Councilman Starsick said that since the State Road garage was moved, that area is very dark. Rosencrance made the motion to authorize a street light for that area of East Main Street. Liller seconded the motion and it carried.

Final budget revisions for the General and Coal Severance Funds were reviewed. Watson made the motion to approve the revisions to both funds as presented. Starsick seconded the motion and it carried.

Pay Requisition #26 in the amount of \$6,550.38 for the Fairmont/Mannington water project was presented for payment. Starsick made the motion to approve payment of Requisition #26. Liller seconded the motion. Starsick and Liller voted aye, Garcia and Watson voted no and Rosencrance abstained. The motion did not carry.

Budget Amendment #11 for the Fairmont/Mannington water project to provide for payment for the chlorine building right of way was the final item on the agenda. Starsick made the motion to approve the amendment. Liller seconded the motion and all approved.

Liller made the motion to adjourn. Rosencrance seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:28 p.m.
