

COUNCIL MEETING OF DECEMBER 19, 2011

The second regular December meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor Bob Garcia presiding was held Monday, December 19, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members attending were Christina Dunigan, Terry Starsick, Rana Taylor and Becky Williams.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last regular meeting and they stood approved as read.

In the visitors' portion of the meeting, Jim Taylor said gravel is needed on the alley that runs behind Hearn's house in Hough Addition.

In department reports, on behalf of the city employees, Superintendent Ted Nice thanked the mayor and council for the recent Christmas bonus. He then gave a report on the work done by his crew. He noted that work will begin on the water run-off problem on Route 250 by Carnes Auto once the slip to Shearer's is repaired in Southside. Nice said the State has agreed to work with the city but will not start on their end until the City gets the drain fixed on our side. The mayor said he would call Charleston.

In Old Business, Mayor Garcia said Anthony Horton got a plat of the DOH property from the Assessor's Office and it shows 21 acres.

In New Business, the only item of business was the Hach service agreement for the chlorine equipment. They will calibrate and clean the equipment twice a year. Dunigan made the motion to approve the agreement. Starsick seconded the motion and it carried.

The mayor asked for an executive session. Starsick made the motion to go into executive session. Dunigan seconded the motion and it carried. The time was 7:15 p.m.

The regular meeting reconvened at 7:20 p.m. with nothing to report. Taylor made the motion to adjourn. Williams seconded the motion and it carried.
