

## COUNCIL MEETING OF JUNE 2, 2014

The first regular June meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor Jim Taylor presiding was held Monday, June 2, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members in attendance were Charlie Kolb, Larry Smith and Terry Starsick.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last meeting and they stood approved as read.

In the visitors' portion of the meeting, Ms West Virginia Kristin Wilson said she needs sponsorship to the Ms United States pageant in Washington, D.C. She said there are a lot of expenses involved in the pageant which takes place in July and she asked if the City could be one of her sponsors. Mayor Taylor said it would be taken under advisement and be on the next meeting's agenda.

In department reports, Code Enforcement Officer Anthony Horton gave an account of his actions for the last two months which included issuing 25 notices, attending six hearings and tagging five vehicles. Superintendent Ted Nice reported on their work detail and said he has contacted Dominion Hope concerning a repair bill that they sent to the City for breaking their line when the drain repairs were done on East Main Street. Nice said Dominion did not mark their lines. He also said they are working on a solution to the drain problem behind Signs & More in Homewood Addition.

In New Business, Taylor recommended that Sam Stillings be reappointed to the Building Commission. Starsick made the motion to reappoint Stillings to a 5-year term on the Commission. Kolb seconded the motion and it carried.

Taylor went into a little more detail on the drain problem behind Signs and More. Smith said he thought the fill has caused the problem but Taylor said the existing pipe is crushed but it is not in the area of the fill. Several options are being considered to correct the problem. Horton said that the fill there is not according to code and council can stop additional fill if they decide to go that route.

Fluharty said the General Fund budget revision must be postponed until the next meeting because she had not had access to her computer for several days due to the conversion to the new machines and subsequent issues with the installation of some of the programs.

The outstanding bills were reviewed. Kolb made the motion to pay the bills. Smith seconded the motion and all approved.

Smith asked when the repairs to the trailhead bathroom will be done so that it can be reopened to the public. Nice said they will get to it this week. Council said the lines should be blown in the fall to prevent the lines from freezing and bursting like they did last winter.

Starsick made the motion to adjourn. Smith seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:18 p.m.
