

## COUNCIL MEETING OF MAY 17, 2010

The second regular May meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor Bob Garcia presiding was held Monday, May 17, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members present were Jeff Michael, Harry Moore, Larry Smith, Terry Starsick and Rana Taylor.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last meeting and they stood approved as read.

Several visitors from Homewood were present once again about the cat problem in that area. Glenn Mayhugh said Carol Liller who is a member of the City's police force released cats that he had trapped and was turning over to the Animal Control officer. He said she had no right to come onto his property. Chief of Police David James said Mayhugh refused to press charges so there is nothing the city can do. Liller has been talked to and has been provided with names of agencies who will take in feral cats. Other than that, the city's hands are tied. Mayhugh said he will come to every meeting until something is done.

Roddy George asked that the pot holes on Terrace Drive and by Leeson's be filled.

In department reports, the mayor read the Street & Water Department report. James read the police department report.

In old business, the first item on the agenda was the John Deere mower that council had previously agreed to purchase through a third party. After it was later determined that it was not the size needed plus a new one could be obtained with grant monies, the mower was not purchased. Starsick made the motion to rescind the motion to purchase the John Deere mower. Smith seconded the motion and all approved.

The second and final reading of the Mead Fund budget for FY 2010-11 was approved in a motion by Starsick. Taylor seconded the motion and it carried.

In new business, a resolution approving the contract with Region 6 RPDC to administer the city's energy grant through the WV Division of Energy was reviewed. Moore made the motion to approve the resolution as presented. Starsick seconded the motion and it carried. A copy of the resolution is attached.

Mayor Garcia asked for approval of the purchase of a Maudlin paver and roller for \$5,000 from North Central Paving. Moore made the motion to approve the purchase of the paver and roller. Starsick seconded the motion and all approved.

The last item of business was the final revision of the FY 2009-10 Coal Severance Fund budget. Starsick made the motion to approve the revision as presented. Taylor seconded the motion and it carried.

Starsick asked when the lamp posts were going to be put up on Market Street. Rexrode said it would be done on the next warm day.

Starsick made the motion to adjourn. Moore seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
