

COUNCIL MEETING OF FEBRUARY 10, 2014

The first regular February meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor Jim Taylor presiding was held Monday, February 10, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. The meeting was rescheduled due to bad weather. Council members present were Larry Smith, Terry Starsick, Richard Stevens and Becky Williams.

There were no visitors.

In department reports, Mayor Taylor read the police report. He noted that they received 186 calls for assistance in January.

Taylor also reported that Reclaim, the contractor on the Longstreth Building demolition, is 7 - 10 days behind schedule due to the weather.

In New Business, the first item on the agenda was the first reading of Ordinance #414 which amends the overlay district to include Buffalo Street. Starsick made the motion to read the heading only. Smith seconded the motion and it carried. Taylor read the heading. Starsick made the motion to accept the first reading of Ordinance #414. Stevens seconded the motion and all approved.

A proposal from Thrasher Engineering to conduct an inspection of the Dent's Run Dam, as mandated by the WV DEP, was reviewed. Smith made the motion to accept the proposal for \$1500. Williams seconded the motion and it carried.

The final item of business was General Fund Budget Revision #4 to allocate funds from the sale of the 2008 Chevy Blazer cruiser to purchase two radar units for the Police Department. Stevens made the motion to approve the budget revision as presented. Smith seconded the motion and all approved.

The outstanding bills were approved for payment in a motion by Smith. Stevens seconded the motion and it carried.

A budget work session was set for 6:00 p.m. on February 18 immediately preceding the next regular meeting.

Starsick made the motion to adjourn. Stevens seconded the motion and all approved. The meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
