

## COUNCIL MEETING OF JULY 19, 2010

The second regular July meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor Bob Garcia presiding was held July 19, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members attending were Jeff Michael, Harry Moore, Larry Smith and Rana Taylor.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last regular meeting and they stood approved as read.

Becka Efaw said Meadow Avenue is still being used as drag strip. Garcia said he asked the DOH about putting a 25 mph sign on Meadow Avenue but it must be approved by Charleston.

Glenn Mayhugh said he is still having problems with cats and he would like the phone number of Brock from the Marion County Humane Society.

Jimmy Stewart presented a proposal to widen the lower end of Poolside Drive. He said it would affect only the Leeson, Stalnaker and Wilson properties. Mayor Garcia said he has talked with Superintendent Charlie Rexrode about widening it but they would like to include the upper end of Poolside Drive too. Stewart said the gas lines come down on his side of the street so they would not need to be moved. It will be put on the next agenda.

Chief of Police David James read the police report for June and said they received 147 calls for assistance.

The mayor read the Street/Water Department report.

As a follow-up to James' report, Fluharty gave a breakdown of the revenue from fines for January through June.

In old business, Garcia said the roller being offered for sale by Rob Yost is a 1987 Mauldin model and it has 1571 hours on it. He has the complete maintenance records for it along with the manual. Smith made the motion to purchase the roller from Rob Yost for \$4,000. Moore seconded the motion and it carried.

General Fund Budget Revision #1 for FY 2010-11 was presented for approval. Moore made the motion to approve the revisions. Michael seconded the motion and it carried. Fluharty said the revisions included funds to purchase the roller from Yost.

Garcia reported that the city was awarded \$20,000 from the Bowers Trust Fund and will receive the check on August 5.

Moving the date of the next council meeting was discussed since it will coincide with the fair parade. Moore suggested changing the August meetings to the 9<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. Smith made the motion to change the council meetings to August 9 and 23. Michael seconded the motion and it carried.

In council reports, Smith reported that the fence on the Rail Trail is broken in several places and Taylor added that it is broken in Northview also. Moore added that ATVs are running on the trail.

Moore made the motion to adjourn. Smith seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
