

COUNCIL MEETING OF NOVEMBER 19, 2012

The second regular November meeting of the Mannington City Council with Mayor Bob Garcia presiding was held Monday, November 19, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. at city hall. Council members attending were Christina Dunigan, Larry Smith, Terry Starsick and Becky Williams.

City Clerk Michele Fluharty read the minutes of the last regular meeting and they stood approved as read.

There were no visitor comments.

Code Enforcement Officer Anthony Horton reported that he issued 20 notices of violation, one order of demolition and attended four hearings. He also said that Subway will be closing their location inside the 7-Eleven Store because 7-Eleven plans to replace it with their own in-house sandwich shop.

The first item of old business was the second and final reading of Ordinance #406 which provides for the sale of surplus city property. Dunigan made the motion to read the heading only of Ordinance #406. Williams seconded the motion and all approved. Garcia read the heading. Smith made the motion to adopt Ordinance #406. Starsick seconded the motion and all approved.

Fluharty said Heather Fluharty has successfully completed her 90-day probation period and she would recommend that she be hired as permanent, part time employee. Dunigan made the motion to hire Fluharty as a regular, part time employee in the city clerk's office. Smith seconded the motion and it carried.

Dunigan reported on vandalism at the park specifically in the bathrooms. She said that Chief of Police David James is working with her to get an estimate on the cost to place security cameras throughout the park. Starsick said he may be able to help her fund those cameras.

Dunigan said she will try to have the print-out on chicken regulations for the next meeting.

Mayor Garcia asked for an executive session to discuss finances. Starsick made the motion to adjourn into executive session. Smith seconded the motion and it carried. The time was 7:10 p.m.

The regular meeting reconvened at 7:35 p.m. with nothing to report.
